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This chapter introduces the SMART Board® 7000 and 7000 Pro series interactive displays.

About this guide

This guide explains how to use a SMART Board 7000 or 7000 Pro series interactive display.

This guide is intended for individuals who use displays in their organizations. Other documentation and resources are available for those who install and maintain displays (see *More information* on page 9).

About the display

The SMART Board 7000 or 7000 Pro series interactive display is the hub of your classroom or meeting room. PC-free embedded computing provides one-touch access to collaborative tools, including a whiteboard, wireless screen sharing and a web browser. There's no need for wires, cables or manual software and firmware updates.

Features

The display includes the following features:

Feature	Description
iQ technology	The display's iQ appliance provides one-touch access to collaborative tools, including a whiteboard, wireless screen sharing and a web browser.
Touch support	You can do everything on the display that you can do at your computer—open and close applications, meet with others, create new documents or edit existing ones, visit websites, play and manipulate videos, and so on—by touching the display's surface. You can use an array of gestures within applications, including panning, scaling, rotating and zooming in and out. The display's support for up to 10 simultaneous touch, writing and erase points enables you and other users to interact with objects on the screen at the same time.
Writing and drawing support	You can write over applications in digital ink using one of the supplied pens, and then erase the digital ink using your palm, the eraser or the erasers on the pens. Up to four users can write or draw digital ink on the screen at the same time. Each pen writes and draws in its own color. The Pen ID™ feature enables you to assign different ink appearances to each pen.
Audio support	The display includes integrated speakers for presenting audio from connected input sources.



iQ appliance

The iQ appliance is installed in the accessory slot on the back of the SBID-7275, SBID-7286 and SBID-7275P models. Take advantage of iQ technology and access collaborative tools.

Exclusive to SMART, HyPr Touch allows for SMART's unique Simultaneous Tool Differentiation—the use of 10 touch points, four pens and two erasers (tool and palm) by multiple users for a truly natural, fully collaborative experience.

Home button

Tap the Home button to open the launcher. From the launcher, you can open the iQ appliance's apps as well as the settings.

Pens

The display comes with black, red, blue and green pens. Each pen has an attached eraser and an indicator light.

The display's bottom frame includes magnetic holders for the pens. Removing a pen from its holder activates it, and you can use the pen to draw or erase digital ink. Replace the pen when you're done using it to charge it.



When you first turn on the display or pick up a pen from the magnetic holder, the pen's light turns on to indicate the pen's status:

Light	Pen status	Action
Solid green	The pen is charging slowly and can be used for at least two hours.	Pick up the pen and use it to write on the display. Return the pen to the magnetic holder when you're done.
Solid amber The pen is charging quickly and can be used for less than two hours.	Use the pen for up to two hours. Return the pen to the magnetic holder when done.

		It is normal for pens to be warm to the touch when charging quickly.

Light	Pen status	Action
Solid red	The pen needs to be charged within 30 minutes.	Finish using the pen and return it to the magnetic holder when done.
Flashing red	The pen needs to be charged within 10 minutes.	Return the pen to the magnetic holder as soon as possible.
Flashing green or amber (while the pen is in the magnetic holder)	The pen's firmware is updating.	Wait for the light to stop flashing. This indicates the pen's firmware has completed updating.

When you return a pen to the magnetic holder, make sure it's centered in its holder to keep it from falling and being damaged. The pen's light turns on to indicate that it's properly positioned in the holder.

Eraser

In addition to the pens, the display includes an eraser, which you can use when you want to erase a large area on the screen.

The display's bottom frame includes a magnetic holder for the eraser. Replace the eraser when you're done with it.





When you return the eraser to the magnetic holder, make sure it's centered in its holder to keep it from falling and being damaged.

Convenience panel

The convenience panel contains buttons for turning the display on and off and controlling the volume. It also includes connectors for USB peripherals and a computer or other input source.



Presence detection sensors

The display has two presence detection sensors on its top frame that can detect people up to 16' (5 m) away when the display is in Standby mode.

When the sensors detect people in the room, the display is ready to turn on. To turn on the display, press the Power button U or pick up a pen or eraser.

If the room is empty for a specified period, the display returns to Standby mode.



Internal speakers

The display includes two 10 W integrated speakers. You can also connect external speakers.

SBA-100 projection audio system

Available for education models, the SBA-100 projection audio system consists of two 14 W speakers and is intended for wall-mounted displays. You can control volume using the display's convenience panel or the digital volume controls in a connected computer's operating system.

Available for education models, the SMART Audio 400 classroom amplification system provides high-quality audio amplification. The amplifier receives audio signals from the microphones and translates them into crystal-clear sound through the speakers.

Chapter 2

Getting started with the display

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This chapter explains how to wake the display when it's asleep, how to view connected computers' input and how to interact with the display.

Waking up the display and putting it back to sleep

The display's presence detection sensors can detect people up to 16' (5 m) away when the display is in Standby mode (in other words, sleeping). When the sensors detect people, the display enters Ready mode and is ready to wake. To wake the display, do one of the following:

- Press the **Power** button U on the convenience panel.
- Pick up a pen or the eraser.

The display returns to a partial sleeping state when one of the following occurs:

- The sensors don't detect people in the room for 60 minutes.
- You press the **Power** button U on the convenience panel.

The display remains in this partial sleeping state until all pens are fully charged. The display enters a full sleeping state after all pens are fully charged.

Using apps on the iQ appliance

You can use the apps on the iQ appliance to complete many of the same tasks you can complete

on a computer (see Chapter 3: Using apps on the display on page 17).

Using SMART software on connected computers

In addition to the iQ appliance, the display comes with SMART software, which you or your organization's system administrators can install on computers that you connect to the display.

The SBID-7075, SBID-7086, SBID-7275 and SBID-7286 models come with SMART Learning Suite, which includes SMART Notebook® collaborative learning software. SMART Notebook software enables you to create .notebook files that include graphics, text, tables, lines, shapes, animations and more.

The SBID-7075P and SBID-7275P models come with SMART Meeting Pro® software. SMART Meeting Pro software enables you to write or draw on a digital whiteboard, present content by sharing your desktop and connect and use integrated conferencing software to collaborate with local or remote participants.





GETTING STARTED WITH THE DISPLAY

You can connect computers with SMART software to the display (as shown below) and then view the computers' input on the display.



NOTES

- To interact with content, connect a USB cable to the appropriate USB Type-B receptacle on the connector panel or convenience panel (as shown in the above diagrams).
- Your organization's installers might have connected cables to the connector panel or the convenience panel and run the cables behind a wall or under the floor to a desk or table where you can place your computer.

To view a connected computer's input

Use the Input app (see Using Input on page 39).


Interacting with content

By touching the display's surface, you can do everything on the display that you can do at your computer. You can also use an array of gestures within applications.









Writing, drawing and erasing

The display includes black, red, blue and green pens, which you can use to write or draw in digital ink. You can erase digital ink using the eraser ends of the pens, the eraser or gestures.



NOTES

• Each pen has a light that turns on to indicate the pen's status.

 If you're viewing a connected computer's input, SMART Ink enables you to write or draw in digital ink over applications, files, folders, websites and any other open window on the computer.

To write or draw in digital ink

- 1. Pick up one of the display's pens.
- 2. Use the pen to write or draw in digital ink.



NOTE

The Pen ID feature enables you to use the pens at the same time and customize their colors and other settings independently.

To erase digital ink

Move a pen's eraser over the digital ink you want to erase.



OR

Move the eraser over the digital ink you want to erase.



OR

Move your fist or palm over the digital ink you want to erase.



Adjusting audio

If you're presenting content with sound, you can use the buttons on the convenience panel to increase and decrease the volume (see *Convenience panel* on page 7).

Freezing the screen

You can temporarily freeze the screen by pressing the **Freeze** button on the convenience panel (see *Convenience panel* on page 7). This is particularly useful when you want to pause a video, an animation or other moving content.

GETTING STARTED WITH THE DISPLAY



Freezing the screen does not pause any applications running on the connected computer. It simply freezes the display of those applications.

To unfreeze the screen, press the **Freeze** button again.

Chapter 3

Using apps on the display

The display includes the following apps:

- Whiteboard
- SMART Notebook® Player
- Browser
- Input
- Screen Share

You can access these apps and the display's settings from the launcher and you can write, draw and erase annotations digital ink using annotations. After you've finished using the display, you can clean up the display for the next user.

Using the launcher

The launcher contains all your apps and settings.

Opening and closing the launcher

To open the launcher

Tap the Home button on the screen.

The launcher appears.

To close the launcher

Select an app, tap the Home button , or tap anywhere on the screen.

The launcher closes.

Adding or removing apps from the launcher

To add or remove apps from the launcher

- 1. Tap the Home button on the screen.
- 2. Tap Settings .

The Settings window appears.

- 3. Select Launcher.
- 4. Select an app's check box to add it to the launcher.

OR

Clear an app's check box to remove it from the launcher.

5. To exit the Settings window, open the launcher and select an app.

Using acetates

When using the Browser or Screen Share apps, you can write or draw on acetates and save them to the Whiteboard library.

Writing, drawing and erasing ink on an acetate

The display includes black, red, blue and green pens, which you can use to write or draw in digital ink. You can erase digital ink using the eraser ends of the pens, the eraser or gestures.

To write or draw on an acetate



If you write or draw over a playing video, the audio will be muted but the video will continue to play.

- 1. Pick up one of the display's pens.
- 2. Use the pen to write or draw in digital ink. The acetate appears as a striped semitransparent layer.



3. When you're done, tap **Close** or **Back** in the command bar to save or exit the acetate.

To erase ink on an acetate



If you erase all the ink, the display returns to the app without saving the acetate.

Saving an acetate

Acetates are saved to the Whiteboard library. Acetates saved in the Whiteboard library can be exported as PDFs to a USB drive. See *Exporting sessions to a USB drive* on page 25.

To save an acetate

- Tap Back ← or Close ⊗.
- 2. Tap **Save** to save the acetate in the Whiteboard Library.

OR

Tap **Discard** to discard the acetate and return to the app.

Closing an acetate

To close an acetate

- 1. There are several ways to close an acetate.
 - Tap **Close** to close the acetate.
 - ∘ Tap ← in the command bar.

- Erase all the ink. See *To erase ink on an acetate* on the previous page for more information.
- o Open the launcher and switch to another app.
- Tap Whiteboard Library to go to the Whiteboard Library.
- 2. Tap **Save** to save the acetate in the Whiteboard Library.

OR

Tap **Discard** to return to the app without saving the acetate.

Opening a saved acetate

Acetates are saved to the Whiteboard library.



To open acetates that have been saved to a USB drive, see Using the Whiteboard on the next page.

To open a saved acetate

- 1. Open the launcher.
- 2. Tap Whiteboard
- 3. Tap Whiteboard Library

4. Select an acetate by tapping the acetate's screen shot.

The acetate appears.



Deleting acetates

- To delete a saved acetate
 - 1. Open the launcher.
 - 2. Tap Whiteboard 1.
 - 3. Tap the Whiteboard Library icon
 - 4. Select an acetate by tapping its check box.

OR

Tap Select All to select all whiteboard sessions and acetates.

5. Tap **Trash** to delete the selected acetates.

Using the Whiteboard



You can view and erase notes, continue a Whiteboard session from the Library and share your Whiteboard using the app.

Opening the Whiteboard

To open the Whiteboard

- 1. Open the launcher.
- 2. Tap Whiteboard 1.

Writing and erasing notes on the Whiteboard

TIP

Use your finger to pan the whiteboard left or right to access more whiteboard space.

Using Panoramic View

Panoramic View provides an overview of the entire Whiteboard. Panoramic View is visible only on the display. Use Panoramic View to quickly view a different part of the Whiteboard.

To show Panoramic View

Touch the Whiteboard near the bottom of the screen.

Panoramic View appears.

To quickly view content using Panoramic View

- 1. Use your finger to move Panoramic View left or right to view the entire writing surface.
- 2. Tap the area you'd like to present.

The display shows the area you selected.

To hide Panoramic View

Panoramic View disappears after five seconds.

Starting a new Whiteboard

To start a new whiteboard

1. Tap the **New Whiteboard** + icon.





Resolving general issues

Issue	Solutions
An app or feature is missing or not available.	 The apps and features available depend on the iQ appliance model. See the Identifying your iQ appliance model wizard. Installing the app and starting it for the first time

You can download and install the SMART kapp app by visiting the Apple App Store or Google Play, or you can install the app on your mobile device by scanning your display's QR code.

Installing the app

To install the app

1. Visit the Apple App Store or Google Play on your mobile device and search for **SMART kapp**.

OR

Start the QR code scanning app on your mobile device, and then hold your mobile device's rear-facing camera over the device's QR code to scan it.

The Apple App Store or Google Play opens.

2. Download and install the app.

Starting the app for the first time

To start the app for the first time

1. Start the SMART kapp app on your mobile device.

The app tutorial appears.

2. Use the swipe gestures to progress through the screens of the tutorial.

3. Tap Close when you have completed the tutorial.

The app home screen appears.



TIP

If you want to see the tutorial again, do the following:

- on an Apple mobile device, tap **Settings** on the app home screen and then select Tutorial.

Connecting and disconnecting the app

The SMART kapp app enables you to connect your mobile device to a display and then do the following:

- View notes you write on the display on your mobile device
- Save and export your notes
- Start a session and invite others to join and collaborate

Connecting

Start a session by connecting your mobile device to a display.



NOTE

Make sure you have the latest version of the app on your mobile device to get the best experience while using the SMART kapp app and to access all the latest features. Some features listed in this documentation may not be available with older versions of the app.

A QR code is a type of bar code. If your mobile device has a rear-facing camera and a QR code scanning app, you can scan QR codes like the one on the display. Your mobile device then executes the QR codes' commands. Typically, QR codes' commands display messages or open web pages.



To connect by QR code

- 1. Start the SMART kapp app on your mobile device.
- 2. Hold your mobile device's rear-facing camera still over the display's QR code so that the QR code appears in the center of the app screen.

The app connects your mobile device to the display.



TIP

If the app doesn't connect your mobile device to the display, move your mobile device closer to or farther away from the display so that the app can capture the QR code.



NOTE

Some Android mobile devices require you to accept a pairing request to connect to the display. Swipe down on the screen to access the notification drawer and accept the pairing request.

Disconnecting

The app disconnects from the current session in the following situations:

- When you close the app
- · Automatically after a period of non-use
- · When the display is outside of your mobile device's Bluetooth communication range, which is approximately 33' (10 m)



NOTE

• When you connect an Android mobile device to the display, an icon appears in the device's notification area. This icon indicates when the mobile device is connected to the display:





Connected

Disconnected

• When you disconnect, the SMART kapp app takes a final snapshot of the display if the content has changed since the last snapshot.

To disconnect the app manually

Tap **Disconnect** in the top left corner of the SMART kapp app screen, and then tap **Disconnect**.

OR

Tap **Disconnect** on the display.

Continuing a previous session

You can easily pick up from where you left off in a previous SMART kapp session. You can continue one of your previous sessions from the last snapshot taken in a session. It doesn't matter if your previous session was on a SMART kapp board or a SMART Board interactive display.



- When you continue a previous session, the content from that previous session replaces any existing content on your display. This content is not permanently erased and will return once you disconnect from your continued session.
- When you continue a session, all the snapshots from that previous session are also
 available. However, as the session's host, these snapshots are only visible to you. If you
 invite remote participants to join your continued session, they will not have access to any
 snapshots taken during the previous session.

To continue a previous session on an iOS mobile device

- 1. If you're currently in a session, disconnect (see Disconnecting on the previous page).
- 2. Tap Sessions .

The Sessions screen appears.

3. Swipe right on the session you want and tap Continue.

OR

In the snapshot library, select the session you want to continue to view and tap **Continue**



The QR scanner appears.

4. Scan the display's QR code.

The last snapshot from your session appears on the display and your mobile device. You can then invite others to join the continued session just as you would with a regular session.

To continue a previous session on an Android mobile device

- 1. If you're currently in a session, disconnect (see Disconnecting on page 66).
- 2. Tap **Sessions** .

The Sessions screen appears.

3. For the session you want to continue, tap **Menu** and select **Continue**.

OR

In the snapshot library, select the session you want to continue to view and tap **Continue**

The QR scanner appears.

4. Scan the display's QR code.

The last snapshot from your session appears on the display and your mobile device. You can then invite others to join the continued session just as you would with a regular session.

Writing, erasing and viewing notes

You can write and erase notes on the display just like you do on a traditional dry-erase board. You can view your notes on the display or in the app.

Use your finger to pan the whiteboard left or right to access more whiteboard space.


Write and erase notes in the app

In addition to writing and erasing notes on the display, you can write or erase them in the app. When you write or erase notes in the app, the changes appear automatically on the display.

To write or erase notes in the app

- 1. Connect your mobile device to the display (see Connecting and disconnecting the app on page 65).
- 2. Tap **Drawing Mode** .

3. Tap the buttons on the bottom of the screen, and then use your fingers to write, erase, pan or zoom.




4. Tap **Done** to return to viewing mode.

Viewing notes

During a session, you can view the notes you've written on the display on your mobile device. As you write or erase notes, the changes appear on your mobile device automatically.

By default, your mobile device displays the entire writing surface. You can use gestures to zoom in or out and pan:





As you zoom in or out, grid lines appear on the writing surface to indicate the level of magnification.

Using Radar View

Radar View provides an overview of the entire Whiteboard. Radar View is visible only on the display. Use Radar View to quickly view a different part of the Whiteboard.

To show Radar View

Touch the Whiteboard near the bottom of the display.

Radar View appears.

To quickly view content using Radar View

- 1. Use your finger to move Radar View left or right to view the entire writing surface.
- 2. Tap the area you'd like to present.

The display shows the area you selected.

To hide Radar View

Radar View disappears after five seconds.

Returning to the host's current view

When you're following the presentation in your web browser or in the SMART kapp app, you can view a section of the writing surface other than the one the host is presenting.

To return to the host's current view

In the SMART kapp app or web browser, select Follow host.

Saving and working with snapshots

As you write notes on a display, you might want to save snapshots of your notes from time to time during the session.

After you save snapshots, you can do the following:

- View the snapshots
- Export the snapshots as JPEG or PDF files
- Delete the snapshots

Saving snapshots to the app

To save a snapshot

1.	Start or connect to a session	(see Connecting	and disconnecting	g the app o	on page 65).

2.	Tap Capture on the display
	OR

Tap **Capture** in the app.

The app saves a snapshot of your notes.



NOTE

The Sessions button in the bottom-right corner of the screen indicates how many snapshots have been saved in the current session.

Viewing snapshots

When you save a snapshot, the app saves it to your session's library. Access your current session or a previous session's library to view your saved snapshots.



TIP

You can use the zoom and pan gestures when viewing snapshots (see *Viewing notes* on page 69).

To view snapshots in the current session

- 1. Take one or more snapshots in the current session (see Saving snapshots to the app above).
- 2. On an Apple mobile device, tap **Sessions** ①.

OR

On an Android mobile device, tap **Sessions** \Box .

The Sessions screen appears.

3. Tap a snapshot's thumbnail image to view the snapshot.

To view snapshots in previous sessions

1.	If you're currently	/ in a session,	disconnect (see	Disconnecting	on page 66).

2. On an Apple mobile device, tap **Sessions** .

OR

On an Android mobile device, tap **Sessions** \Box .

The Sessions screen appears.

3. Select a session to view the snapshots saved for that session.

The session's snapshot library appears.

4. Select a snapshot's thumbnail image to view the snapshot.

Exporting snapshots

If you want to share snapshots of your notes, you can use the app to export them and then use a third-party app on your mobile device to share your snapshots as a PDF or JPEG file.

To export a snapshot

- 1. View the snapshot you want to export (see Viewing snapshots on the previous page).
- 2. On an Apple mobile device, tap **Export** $\stackrel{\triangle}{\Box}$, and then select **Save to Camera Roll**, **Share as PDF** or a cloud service.

OR

On an Android mobile device, tap **Menu**, and then select **Save to Camera Roll**, **Share as PDF** or a cloud service.

- 3. If you selected **Share as Image** or **Share as PDF**, select the app you want to use to share the snapshot.
- 4. Use the selected app to share the snapshot.

To export all snapshots saved in the current session

- 1. Save one or more snapshots in the current session (see *Saving snapshots to the app* on the previous page).
- 2. Tap **Sessions** .

The Sessions screen appears.

3.	On an Apple mobile device, tap Export .
	OR
	On an Android mobile device, tap Menu , and then select Share as Image or Share as PDF .
4.	Select the app you want to use to export the snapshots.
5.	Use the selected app to export the snapshots.

- 6. Use the selected app to export the snapshots.

Deleting snapshots

You can delete snapshots individually or delete an entire session and all of its saved snapshots.

- 5. Tap **Delete** $\widehat{\mathbb{I}}$, and then tap **Delete**.

To delete a previous session on an iOS mobile device

- 1. If you're currently in a session, disconnect (see Disconnecting on page 66).
- 2. Tap Session .

The Sessions screen appears.

- 3. Select Edit.
- 4. Tap the session's **Delete** button, and then tap **Delete**.
- 5. Tap Done.

To delete a previous session on an Android mobile device

- 1. If you're currently in a session, disconnect (see Disconnecting on page 66).
- 2. Tap Sessions .

The Sessions screen appears.

- 3. Tap **Menu**, and then select **Select**.
- 4. Select the session.
- 5. Tap **Delete** , and then tap **Delete**.

Sharing sessions

During a session, you can use the SMART kapp app to invite up to 250 people to view your notes on their mobile or desktop devices.



№ NOTE

You can share notes only as long as the SMART kapp app is running on your mobile device and the device is connected to a display.

Sharing sessions

When you share a session with others, they can tap or click a link to view your session in their web browsers; they don't need to install additional software or otherwise configure their devices. Alternatively, others can choose to install the SMART kapp app on their mobile devices and use it to connect to your session.

As you make changes to your notes, others see these changes in real time. They can also zoom in or out and save, view and export snapshots.

- You can share notes only as long as the SMART kapp app is running on your mobile device and the device is connected to a display.
- · You can export saved snapshots of notes without connecting your mobile device to a display (see Exporting snapshots on page 72).

To share your session

1. Connect your mobile device to a display (see Connecting and disconnecting the app on page 65).

- 2. Tap Invite Ω^+ , and then select **Send Link**.
- 3. Select the app you want to use to send the invitation.
- 4. Use the selected app to send the invitation.

Setting the shared session link type

When you invite others to join your session, the app sends them a dynamic link by default. When you use a dynamic link, the app creates a new link each time you send an invitation for others to join your session.

You can also use a static link. A static link is the same each time you send an invitation. With a static link, you can send the link before meetings start to help simplify meeting startup.

To use a static link instead of a dynamic link, change the invitation link preferences in the app's settings.

To use a static link

- 1. If you're currently in a session, stop sharing the session (see *Stopping sharing* on the facing page).
- 2. On an Apple mobile device, tap **Settings** ②.

OR

On an Android mobile device, tap **Menu**, and select **Settings**.

- 3. Select **Sharing**, and then select **Static Link**.
- 4. Optionally, select **Send Link**, and then select a method to send the static link to others.

Securing shared sessions

In the SMART kapp app, you can add password security to protect your sessions before you send a link to share them. Others will have to use the password you set to join your shared session.

To use a password

- 1. If you're currently in a session, stop sharing the session (see *Stopping sharing* on the facing page).
- 2. On an Apple mobile device, tap **Settings** ②.

OR

On an Android mobile device, tap **Menu**, and select **Settings**.

3. Select **Sharing**, and then select **Password**.

The Enter Password screen appears.

- 4. Select Require a Password.
- 5. Type up to 32 characters for a password.
- 6. Tap **OK**.

To remove the password

- 1. If you're currently in a session, stop sharing the session (see Stopping sharing below).
- 2. On an Apple mobile device, tap **Settings** ②.

OR

On an Android mobile device, tap **Menu**, and select **Settings**.

3. Select **Sharing**, and then select **Password**.

The Enter Password screen appears.

- 4. Clear the Require a Password option.
- 5. Tap **Done**.

Stopping sharing

You can stay connected to the display but stop sharing the current session.

To stop sharing a session

- 1. Tap **Invite** $\overset{\circ}{a}$, and then tap **Options**.
- 2. Tap Stop Sharing.
- 3. Tap **Stop Sharing** to end sharing the session.

Connecting to another session

If another person shares a session with you, you can connect to that session using the SMART kapp app on your mobile device. Once connected, you can do everything in the other person's session that you can do in your own sessions:

- Write and erase notes
- View notes

- Save snapshots of notes
- Share snapshots

You can also connect your own display to the session, and then view and interact with notes using the display. Changes you make on your display appear automatically on the other person's display. Changes made on their display appear on yours.

To connect to another session on a mobile device

- 1. From your mobile device, open the email invitation the session's host sent.
- 2. Tap the link in the email.

If you have the SMART kapp app installed, the app opens and displays the notes the other person is sharing.



NOTE

If the SMART kapp app isn't installed on your mobile device, follow the on-screen instructions to install it.

To connect to another session on a desktop

- 1. From your computer, open the email invitation the session's host sent.
- 2. Click the link in the email.

The SMART kapp app opens in your computer's default browser, displaying the notes the other person is sharing.

To connect your own display to the session

1. Using your mobile device, connect to the remote session.

You will be asked if you want to open the session in the SMART kapp app.

- 2. Open the session in the SMART kapp app.
- 3. On an Apple mobile device, tap Menu ..., and then select Connect to kapp iQ.

OR

On an Android mobile device, tap **Menu**, and then select **Connect to kapp iQ**.

The Connect to kapp iQ screen appears.

4. Hold your mobile device's rear-facing camera still over the display's QR code so that the QR code appears in the center of the app screen.

The app connects your mobile device to the display. The other person's shared notes appear on the display.



If the app doesn't connect your mobile device to the display, move your mobile device closer to or farther away from the display so that the app can capture the QR code.

- 5. View the notes the other person is sharing and write your own notes. Others in the session will see your notes.
- 6. Tap **Disconnect** when done.

Why is there a pause when I open a SMART Notebook file?	Load times haven't been optimized yet. Some files load in 10 seconds, and other files take longer. TIP Tap SMART Notebook Player Library Library and then tap the file's thumbnail to open the file again. This may make a file load more quickly.
Where has the Flash® content gone?	The display no longer supports Flash content. SMART Notebook Player displays a placeholder when there is Flash content on a page. See the <i>SMART kapp iQ system software 2.5 release notes</i> (smarttech.com/kb/171135) for more information.
Why don't all the SMART Notebook tools appear?	SMART Notebook Player interface is designed to minimize distractions and to maximize displayed content. Some content-creation tools have been removed. It's similar to Adobe® Acrobat® Reader® versus the full experience of Adobe Acrobat.

Frequently asked questions about SMART Notebook Player on iOS devices

Is SMART Notebook Player free?	Notebook Player is free to download. A subscription to SMART Learning Suite is required to access features like controlling the SMART Notebook file from the mobile device.
How do I sign in to SMART Notebook Player?	Sign in with the same $Google^m$ or $Microsoft^m$ account used to sign in to SMART Learning Suite.
How did my SMART Notebook files appear in Notebook Player?	SMART Notebook files were shared to the board using the Share to Board feature in SMART Notebook 17 software or later. See <i>To open SMART Notebook files using Share To Board</i> on page 27 for more information.
Can I use a cloud service like Google Drive™ to upload SMART Notebook files?	Not at this time. SMART is working on a solution for this.
Do the mobile device and display need to be on the same network?	No. The mobile device and display can be connected to different networks.
